### 2015 Legislative Bills in CO & NM to Support Rainwater Harvesting



Legislation is being introduced in both the Colorado and New Mexico state legislative bodies this session to support and enhance rainwater catchment. The New Mexico bill is for a tax credit for the installation of new rainwater harvesting systems. Last year, a similar bill in NM made it through two committees before dying in a third prior to the end of the 2014 session. In Colorado, which as a state has among the most restrictive rainwater harvesting regulations in the country, "a bill for an act concerning incentives for precipitation harvesting" is being worked on for submission to the Colorado State General Assembly. Both the NM and CO bills are still being developed but look to be submitted to their respective committees in the next couple of weeks. ## WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT 2014-2015 Cost Share Guidelines

#### Eligible Applicants

Any person addressing a natural resource problem who owns land within the Edgewood Soil & Water Conservation District boundaries is eligible.

#### **Applications**

Applications will be received from April 1, 2015 – June 5, 2015.

Projects within city limits are not eligible.

#### Payments:

- o Payment will be made on **75%** of the actual cost of the project.
- o Maximum payment for all projects will be \$4500 per year, per landowner.
- Original receipts must be submitted for reimbursement.
- o Reimbursement will not be made for the purchase of tools.

Water Harvesting Projects on new construction or where mandated by the county will not be approved.

#### **Eligible Practices Include:**

Brush Management, Critical Area Planting, Cross Fencing, Diversion, Water Harvesting, Windbreaks, Windbreak Drip Systems, Forest Irrigation Stand Improvement, Irrigation Pipeline, Low Energy Precision Application (LEPA) Conversion, Livestock Pipeline. (Others practices may be eligible)
